

A night in the pub – at Norwich Theatre Royal!

Choreographer and theatre maker Rhiannon Faith would like to invite you to step into an evening at the local pub, but a night at the local like no other!

Her award nominated new dance/theatre show *Lay Down Your Burdens* comes to *Norwich Theatre Royal* on Friday 28 & Saturday 29 March. It's set in a friendly and welcoming working-class pub where landlady Sara welcomes the same regulars nightly, listening to their stories and woes. Then, one day, a stranger with an excess of baggage gets blown in from the cold...

The show is inspired by the Bob Dylan song Lay Down Your Weary Tune and music is a key element. There's an original score by John Victor (of London band Gengahr) alongside live original music played by Ceilidh duo Ólta Duo.

Featuring a cast of 6 dancer/performers and 2 musicians, the audience sit on three sides, as guests in the pub and are welcome to join the conversations that go round the bar. With radical tenderness, humour and intoxicating behaviour we can experience joy and togetherness, explore the beauty of humanity and our eternal need for community and compassion.

It's an evocative recreation of the pub as a centre-point of British working-class culture, drawing on Rhiannon's own family roots for inspiration. There's dubious karaoke and riotous pub games as the hyper-real pub meets dance theatre, drawing together

those who have been estranged or never even dreamed they were connected.



Rhiannon Faith explained 'Lay Down Your Burdens invites us to share what we are carrying. It's a space where we are listened to and where our worries and troubles are held - and in return there's music, poetry and dance. But mostly, in the theatre, in our pub, we see one another and for a brief moment we are all connected. Current world events can feel overwhelming, so it seems vital for us to come together to share the weight of our troubles knowing that we are not alone.'

The show enjoyed a highly acclaimed week-long world premiere at The Barbican in London last year and the Norwich dates are part of a national tour. Following the premiere it was nominated for a prestigious Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in Dance. Rhiannon Faith makes work that raises awareness and lobbies for change. As The Guardian recently put it 'one of the few UK artists making dance theatre that is pointedly socially conscious'

Winter Gardening

I love the cold months of the year and am out every day.
However, the days are short, and in the absence of being able
to do anything on the allotment, and having perused several
seed catalogues and websites several times over already, I
like nothing better than snuggling up with a good book. So



today, when the temperature hasn't risen above zero degrees all day, I would like to recommend the novel 'Old Herbaceaous' by Reginald Arkell, who in his time was quite a famous poet and scriptwriter. This compact little book was first published in 1950 and is now available for free on various internet platforms.

Pinnegar, or the Old Herbaceous of the title, is the endearing and slightly feared head gardener of a big house in a small village during a time of change. In the beginning of the novel, when the 80s are mentioned, think corsets, crinolines and servants rather than perms and shoulder pads. Pinnegar reaches the pinnacle of his career when he is allocated the Gardener's Cottage to live in and becomes the country's top flower show judge.

Although what this easy to read novel describes is very alien in lots of ways, to gardeners many elements will also be very familiar. There is the rhythm of the seasons, decisions to be made about plants, the best tools to use, views about the right way of doing things, what to enter into the annual show. It is a read that will make you feel connected with gardening when there isn't a lot to do. Enjoy!

Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

Concluding their 22 date UK tour Christina Alden and Alex Patterson's homecoming concert at the Arts centre was a triumph. A packed out audience were treated to a selection of songs from their forthcoming album alongside now established one's and the occasional cover. 'The Polar Bear song' is a new addition to their harmony laden nature themed canon of songs, while a personal favourite but yet to be released 'Our House' about Christina's growing up in a musical household had the audience singing along. Storytelling 'The Cobblers daughter' and the nature based 'Hunter' sit neatly alongside the parental 'Etta's song' for their daughter, Alex's instrumental 'Bina's jig' that he wrote for Christina and a delightful cover of Fleet Foxes 'White Winter Hymnal'. Much like a Norwich concert from 2023 they were accompanied by John Parker on double bass and had Chris Riddell's live illustrations to accompany the songs projected on to a backdrop. Several tours later they have gained more confidence on stage, and seem more relaxed and at ease there. Their new album will be one to watch out for in 2025. The Solstice Psychedelic circus included 2 fine local solo artists in Peter Turrell and Chad Mason. Such is the respect for Peter's dextrous classical guitar playing that you could have heard a pin drop notably on a piece by Saint Seans from the Carnival of the Animals. Chad's stage demeanour is always relaxed and humorous while his songs reflect and comment upon everyday life or personal events to great effect. The night was headlined by The Behind the Sun collective whose Space rock swirling synths and psychedelic guitars over intricate bass and drum lines evoke the spirit of Hawkwind and Hillage notably on 'Sorceress of the apocalypse', Bass man Cosmo will be running the nights on the third Wednesday every 3 months at the Brickmakers with the next one being on the 19th March. The Behind the Sun collective are also supporting Solko and Killamonjambo at Voodoo Daddy's on the 28th February. 2024 My own personal musical year- A very busy

year press and promotions agency wise I worked

with 35 different artists and bands mostly in the folk. prog, psychedelia, jazz, world and Americana areas promoting their albums, singles and tours gaining them airplay, reviews, features and interviews, plus a Folk festival, African music festival and Folk stage production. It was great to work with them all. By all means get in touch if you think I could help. Penguins Go Pop wise at present I am unsure of our future, line up, and direction but am writing songs for an album as well as returning to writing a book. Hopefully both will emerge later in the year together with the band in some format. Fingers crossed. 
