

Vanessa and Tobias together

Sculptor Vanessa Pooley and artist Tobias Arnup are to host their first-ever joint exhibition.

Anessa & Tobias Together will be staged at the Fairhurst Gallery in Norwich from Saturday, June 7 to Saturday, June 14.

The married couple, who have been together for 50 years, have never exhibited side by side before.

"It is very exciting to celebrate working together in a much more public way than we have ever done before," says Vanessa.

Tobias agrees: "I think the bodies of work complement each other; we rejoice in the fact we work alongside each other every day at home and probably influence each other in little ways."

Vanessa is known for her powerful, curvaceous bronze pieces that celebrate the female form through both abundant strength and exquisite tenderness.

She expects to exhibit around 24 smaller pieces, with her latest sculpture, Family of Five, as a centrepiece.

Tobias, who will be showing about 12 of his most recent paintings, creates intricate artwork that lifts the soul through its glorious vibrancy. Depicting objects and flowers through still life, his shapes are created with black lines filled with bold colour.

"Our work is very different but we find some of the processes mutually very supportive and interesting," he says.

Having spent 35 years working as an art therapist, Tobias has recently been able to dedicate much more time to his paintings.

He adds: "Having support from someone else allows you to make choices and gives you space, particularly in those times when you look at a blank canvas or a lump of clay and think what am I going to do now?

"It can be difficult and that is acknowledged between us – and it is nice that we are still doing that together."

Rabbits - check your bunny's bums daily. Ensure they are clean and free from droppings. Fly strike can take hold in less than 24 hours. If your rabbit constantly has

a messy behind, talk to your vet as they can help with this problem.

Rabbits also need a cool shady spot to rest up in during hot weather and plenty of water.

Ticks. Are increasing in number and will bite people as well as dogs and cats. Even if you are using a preventive, ticks will still bite, so check your dog after every countryside walk. Ticks carry many diseases, including Lyme's disease - more serious in people than in dogs.

If you are bitten and see a target shaped rash around the bite. seek medical advice.

Cats generally enjoy the heat, but can get skin cancers. The thinly haired white areas over the ears and nose have least protection from the sun's rays.

If your cat has white ears or a white nose, apply pet friendly sunscreen easier on the ears than the nose!

Excess heat is not good for any pet, but elderly and young pets and those with heart conditions struggle the most.

I find misting them with a plant sprayer or a rub down with a cool sponge more effective than the cooling mats alone. If your dog does become overheated you will see excessive panting, dizziness



and collapse. Cool them with copious water - jugs of cold from the kitchen tap is fine, and once soaking, get them to the vet.





One Self: The Creative Life of Colin Self at Norwich Castle

The first major retrospective of Colin Self's work in 17 years is on show at Norwich Castle from 29 March – 21 September 2025. Containing 130 works of art, it celebrates the boundless creative spirit of an artist whose dedication to his work spans over six decades. Encompassing his famous early work as a major figure in the Pop art movement of the 1960s, the exhibition charts his subsequent artistic course, showcasing some of his lesser-known work, with many works on display for the first time.





major redevelopment project, transforming the iconic Norman Keep by reinstating the layout of the medieval period and making all of the floors accessible. The new museum entrance is already open with the new light-filled atrium housing the new shop and cafe. The Castle Keep itself is planned to reopen in all its medieval glory later in the year.



Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

In May I got to see Dorie Jackson, and Merry Hell at Folk on the pier, and Melin Melyn at the Arts centre, and have copies of their new albums as well. Both live and on her new album 'Stupid Says Run' DORIE JACKSON has created a subtle set of songs that seep into your soul the more you listen to them. Lyrically themes range from the deeply personal (Dementia on 'The Photo'), to the mythical ('Sun Horse') and historical ('Remember Majuba') while musically the songs are imbued with folk, jazz and prog influences over which her vocals float. Hints of Renaissance she is a member of the band Kaprekas Constant and her dad is former Van Der Graaf man David Jackson. These are songs that may take time to appreciate, but are well worth the perseverance. MERRY HELL are a joyous tour de force who have, quite rightly, won numerous awards for best live band, album, single, and band of the year and their new album 'Rising of the Bold' may be their finest so far. 4 of the 8 members share a surname. Kettle, and 3 of them are the main songwriters, namely John, Bob and Virginia. Wow!! can they pen a positive song with a message and restore a skip to your step. From the outset with Virginia's call to 'Pick yourself up and dance' to banish the blues, to their plea to stick to what you believe in on the title track, and the anthemic antidote to conflict 'Peace can be louder than war' with its thousand strong backing vocals there's an upbeat feel of we can, and will overcome adversity. That theme continues on 'Join Hands', 'Don't say I, say us', 'Not everything is wrong' and 'Singing in the morning', all songs of community and unity. If we work together we can make it a reality. The album is truly magnificent as was their live set during which some of the new album was aired alongside old favourites including 'There's a ghost in my house', the plea to be yourself on 'Loving the skin your in', and audience sway and sing along 'Bury me naked'. A superb band full of talented, grounded and lovely people. They are playing between 1.30 and 2.30 pm on the Sunlight stage at the First light festival in Lowestoft on

Sunday 22nd June and its free. Just be there. You won't regret it. Meanwhile at the Arts centre those wonderful Welsh wizards MELIN MELYN collectively dressed as Windy Miller drew us into their weird and wacky world centred around their 'Mill on the hill' that their greedy landlord wants to demolish. Harmony laden, 60s West coast and psychedelic pop permeates on their endlessly appealing cheery and whimsical songs. Both the album and live set with audience involvement and onstage addition of 'Henk' (a dummy who built their beloved mill) are and were delightfully surreal and entertaining. If you like the Super Furries, Gorky's and the Soft Hearted Scientists you will love Melin Melvn. I did. Sadly I missed CHRISTINA ALDEN AND ALEX PATTERSON'S launch for their 'Safe Travels' album but the album itself is a rather lovely and personal insight into their lives in the post covid era. As they state it was 'inspired by home, family and the environment'. Beautifully played and harmoniously sung home and family loom large on the title song wishing safe journey's for loved one's, and 3 songs relating to their daughter on a parents love for a child on 'Etta's song', Christina's hospital trauma's on 'A Hundred Years Ago' and how she coped by reading 'The Starless Sea'. I have stated before how her tale of growing up in a musical household 'Our house' with its sing-along chorus may well be their finest moment so far. Wonderful. Alex's short sweet instrumental 'Raven Yard' thematically leads into their love of nature and the environment with songs about resourceful polar bears, clever crows, and the plight of the mountain hare concluding the collection it feels like a personal musical diary charting 2 years in their lives, and how they chartered their way through them. Charming, personal and warm hearted. A mention too for John Parker's delightful double bass lines. 5 albums I have been promoting- Steve Tilston- Last Call- His final album, Paul Armfield- Between the Covers- A literate gem, Lorenzo Bedini- Who Never Was-Psychedelia and Prog, Phil Martin-Freedom of


