



How can you best meet your indoor cats emotional and behavioural needs?

Dogs are renowned for their sense of smell, but cats' noses are just as sensitive. Much of their communication is scent based - face rubbing and scratching leaves reassuring scent marks around the house.

Wash bedding in rotation so that there is always some of their own scent present. Try not to use too many reed diffusers or strong-smelling home cleaning products which will overpower the cats own delicate pheromones.

Although indoors, cats can still smell prowlers and strays outside. The scent

> of a feral tom will be particularly alarming. They will feel safer if there are curtains or plant pots at the window and if patio doors are blocked off

Cats think and move in three dimensions. They will enjoy having resting ledges at several levels. Think cat trees. shelves and on top of the wardrobe or kitchen cabinets.

Being up high makes them feel safe.

Cats prefer food, water and litter stations to all be separate from each other. The general rule is to have one of each for each cat, and one extra. This will allow housemates to access what they need easily without being bullied by another cat in the house.

Unhappy cats will express themselves by toileting in odd places, fighting, hiding or showing other behaviour changes.







Evening of medieval music

Sat 4 Oct. 7.30pm Booking open for tickets

A rare chance to come to an Evening of medieval music taking place in the historic church of St. Michael and All Angels, Geldeston.

The evening gives us a chance to experience music that was being performed in the early days of the church from the Anglo-Saxon and Medieval periods (dating from approx. the 900-1150 and 1400-1600). It will be played on replicas of contemporary instruments including the harp psaltery, a rebec (an early form of violin), an Anglo-Saxon lyre (copy of one found at Sutton Hoo), in addition to bells, percussion and reed instruments. Anglo Saxon music was mostly transferred orally with only a few fragments written down and these provide a basis for the music performed, with other sources from medieval France and England including the Court of Elenor of Aquitaine.

Adding further to the authenticity, the players wear period costumes with a change in the second part of the programme.

Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

Festival season has arrived, and having recently enjoyed a Saturday at the Dereham Blues festival and Sunday at First Light in Lowestoft here are 3 more festivals that I can thoroughly recommend. FOLK EAST- August 15th to 17th. Having spent the last decade based at Glemham hall this year the festival is moving to its new home on the 3,500 acre Sotterley estate near to Beccles. With ancient woodlands, lakes and its own 12th century church it appears to be an equally grand and suitable site. There are always special events at Folk East and the one that stands out this year for me is the aptly named Second Cousins stage on the Saturday as a 60th anniversary tribute to the legendary London venue Les Cousins that hosted many of the finest acoustic acts and singer songwriters from the mid 60s to early 70s. 4 surviving artists namely Bridget St John, Steve Tilston, lan A Anderson, and John Altman will be taking to the stage together with new artists who embody the spirit and ethos of the original venue. Saturday also sees Sam Amidon, Megson, Kathryn Tickell and the Darkening, and Katie Spencer among others performing at the festival. Friday's line up includes Good Habits, Sheelanagig. Tarren, John and Lynne Ward, Longest Johns, The Tamsin Elliott Trio, and Pound, Stevens and Macfarlane performing 'Earth, The Silent Planet', while Sunday brings among others The Finn Collinson band, Gigspanner trio, Aldridge and Goldsmith, Kris Drever, Penguin Café, Sam Carter and Tim Edev. Equally there will be a wide range of workshops, food and drink, a youth moot, Art Arcade, Dance tents, talks, and a book club. For more info www. folkeast.co.uk Saturday 16th August also sees the second year of AFRI FEST at Chapelfield Gardens in Norwich, Billed as a vibrant celebration of African culture, music, and cuisine artists performing include the Congolese rumba and rock band Zong Zing All Stars, Kenyan music artist Bien (Sauti

Sol), London based Afrobeat artists YXL, Ayo, and Nubia, together with superb Kora player Sefo Kanuteh who has been residing in Norwich for more than a decade. More info- https://theafrifest.com/

The weekend of the 5th to 7th September sees the BUNGAY FOLK FESTIVAL taking over the town for a second year with more than 50 artists and bands playing mostly for free, with some paid concerts and a wealth of workshops taking place. Venues taking part include the Fisher Theatre, St Mary's and Holy Trinity churches, The Bell Gallery, Number 28 café, The Community Centre, The Riverside Centre, and the library as well as a whole host of artists playing the 3 Tuns pub. Some of the artists playing for free include The Larks, Homity, Tangled up in Bob, John Ward, Alden and Patterson, Clark and Zuppardi, Wendsum, The King Driscolls, Rattlebox and Will Fergusson. 


