

e all know what cats are like at taking pills. It's a good thing that cats are quite small, much bigger and it would be like sharing your house with a mini tiger and we'd have to give everyone a dart gun.

Here are strategies that you can try to get your cat to take medication.

- 1. Store the medication in the fridge or pop it in the freezer for twenty minutes. By cooling the medication, you reduce any smell.
- 2. Mix with something tasty or new. E.g. tuna, mackerel, fish or meat paste, cheese, butter, ham, prawns, lick-e-lix, churros, cream cheese, liver paste.
- **3.** This works even better if medication is chilled and the food is slightly warm.

 Ask your vet if there is an alternative form of medication, e.g. 'spot on' products or a liquid or flavoured form. 5. Use a pill popper. These are a little bit like a syringe and will grip the tablet so that you can administer it into your cat's mouth without risking fingers.

6. Warm your spot-on treatments before applying – keep it in a pocket for half an hour. Dripping body temperature liquid onto their skin is far less noticeable than cold drops.

7. Ask someone else to do it. (This was the most popular answer from my team when I asked them – what is your top tip for tabletting a cat!). Seriously, cat bites are dangerous. If you think you may get bitten, or you are unable to give the tablets by any

Fatherhood explored in Norwich Theatre's **Creative Matters** season

Norwich Theatre is dedicating a mini season to fatherhood as part of its tenth Creative Matters season, The Shape of

Creative Matters: The Shape of Family reflects the vast spectrum of experiences that make up modern families today and will use a mixture of performances, film, workshops, and art to stimulate discussion and make connections through creativity. The mini season (The Shape of Family: Fatherhood) running from 11 Oct - 8 Nov will have a specific focus on the complexities of fatherhood.

Elspeth Hunter, Creative Engagement Project Manager at Norwich Theatre, said: "With the strong evidence of how children benefit from positive fathering, it's important that men have spaces to explore, listen and reflect on what it means to be a dad in the world today."



The Shape of Family: Fatherhood begins with a screening of How's Your Father (11 Oct), a powerful theatre show based on real-life accounts from academic research. The show was

a collaboration between The University of East Anglia, local theatre maker Simon Floyd, local charity Menscraft, and Norfolk County Council. The show tells the stories of four men and their encounters with authority, raising different questions about what it means to be a father. The audience is invited to a post-show Q&A discussion. On 1 Nov, the programme continues with a free screening of the 2014 film Boyhood.

Comedian Joe Wells will bring a unique perspective to the stage with his show, Daddy Autism (2 Nov), at Norwich Theatre Playhouse. Poet and father Dr.

Ashley Hickson-



Lovence will lead Writing through Fatherhood (6 Nov), a creative writing workshop designed for dads.

On 8 Nov. Man Alive Theatre will host The Life of Dads, an interactive workshop offering participants the opportunity for self-reflection and exploration by using drama techniques.

The Shape of Family: Fatherhood season is supported by partners UEA and MensCraft.

Dr Georgia Philip, School of Social Work, University of East Anglia, said: "As academics, we want our research to make a difference in the world, and using theatre and storytelling is such a powerful way to do that. The topic of fatherhood is relevant and emotive for all of us, and we need ways of exploring it that challenge assumptions, raise expectations, and better support men's parenting."

For Elspeth, the season The Shape of Family: Fatherhood is about challenging assumptions. "The season is a vital opportunity for fathers, and everyone who cares about them, to engage with these issues head-on. By attending a screening, joining a workshop, or simply starting a conversation, we can all contribute to a world where fathers are fully recognised and where parenting is shared more equally."



Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

FOLK EAST- After more than a decade at their previous home of Glemham hall their inaugural year at the Sotterley estate near Beccles proved to be a huge success. Although I managed to see extracts of or full sets by 28 acts over the course of the weekend here are my 6 favourites with 2 from each day. Friday-Local folk luminaries The Shackleton Trio's enchanting set of storytelling songs, many with an animal theme, and upbeat instrumentals and Good Habits blend of musical dexterity, catchy originals and unique take on songs from other musical genres had to be heard to be believed. Saturday's 60th anniversary tribute to the legendary long lost Les Cousins club included great sets from artists who played at the venue most notably Steve Tilston who mixed nostalgic songs from his recent and final album 'Last Call' with some from his 1971 debut album, while Bridget St John took us back to her 1969 debut album alongside songs by and memories of 3 of her 'musical brothers' namely Nick Drake, Michael Chapman and John Martyn. Sunday's highlights for me came in largely instrumental formats in an early afternoon set by The Finn Collinson trio debuting much of what will be their 3rd album that promises to be packed full of intricately played mostly lively tunes inspired by Finn's travels, and a superb end to the festival by Penguin Café now led by Arthur Jeffes son of original founder Simon paying homage to his father's musical legacy and delving into their back catalogue including of course the superb 'Music for a found harmonium'. My annual 4,000 word in depth review of the weekend is now online on the Fatea website here- https:// www.fatea-records.co.uk/magazine/live/FolkEast25. php/The second BUNGAY FOLK FESTIVAL set around the town and over the first weekend in September packed the place out with people wandering from venue to venue in what is a largely free event. I made it to the Saturday and found myself mostly going back and forth between the 2 churches of St Mary's and the Holy Trinity for some very fine music. Birds inspired the fine instrumental Harp and Guitar tunes of The Blow In's, and having missed Alden and Patterson at Folk East it was great to see them here playing their own nature themed songs in 'The Greenland Shark' and 'Hunter' alongside audience sing-along 'Our house' about Christina's childhood of growing up in a

musical household that is already becoming a classic song. Largely instrumental sets followed during the day from Tanglethread encompassing early music and Irish tunes, The East Suffolk folk orchestra mixing jaunty tunes from Scotland with subtle Scandinavian compositions, and Terza's European folk tunes in interesting time signatures and sprightly folk dance tunes. The John Ward trio mixed locally themed songs about Lowestoft and Dunwich with topical political songs, most notably 'The Flim Flam Man' while stepping in at the last minute Miniature Universe played a mesmerising and atmospheric set of meditative music on fiddle and hang drum. The evening in the 3 Tuns brought more raucous sets and audiences with Rattlebox mixing traditional songs with comments on the current state of the world and The King Driscoll's popular around these parts to say the least propelling people to their feet mixing original songs with upbeat covers. A great event well done to organisers Pete and Vicky Sewell who are putting Bungay on the musical map. Finally I really enjoyed my first ever visit to the Gorleston Clifftop festival with the pop prog band Q and A playing renditions of 10cc, Supertramp and ELO songs being a favourite, while I managed to get to a couple of The Summer sessions around Norwich that included great sets by Kitewing, Moore and Moss, and Beat Fiasco among others. I hope you had a good Summer.
