





Keep festive food out of reach. Chocolate, mince pies/puddings, nuts and cake as well as turkey leftovers and sweets containing artificial sweeteners, can make pets very sick. Keep holiday food and drink well out of reach.

Keep your vet's phone number handy, in case of emergencies, and ensure that you have enough of your pet's medication to see them over the holiday period. Make sure microchip details are up to date as pets often slip out during all the comings and goings.

Beware tinsel, decorations, electric cords and candles, which can all be attractive to pets but can

cause accident and injury. Do not leave your pets unattended.

In between all the festivities, try and stick to your pet's

routine as much as possible. Ensure they have enough quiet time and a safe room or space to use as a refuge, so that they can chose whether or not to join in.

In cold weather, check under your car and bang the bonnet before starting, as cats often climb onto engines for warmth. Mop up all antifreeze spills. This is sweet tasting to pets and highly toxic.

In snow, use coconut oil on paws and fur to avoid snowballs clinging to fur and to protect against salt and grit. Wash paws on returning home.

New years resolutions such as loosing weight and taking more exercise are great for

pets too!

I live near a pumpkin grower whose pumpkin festival lasted one day in its infancy. This year it lasted the whole of October. Consequently, the area given over to growing pumpkins has increased and, looking from the outside, the event was extremely successful. Apparently, we have an enormous need for pumpkins.

I first noticed how many pumpkins were left in the fields after the Big Day about ten years ago. At the time the farmer told me that pumpkins are a crop which produces a massive profit per pumpkin. so it didn't matter if a few were left to rot. Nothing seems to have changed in the last ten years.

Call me old fashioned, but I think of pumpkins as food rather than Halloween decoration.

I remember when American Pie was made with a velvety, custard-like pumpkin filling, bakeries made pumpkin muffins and pumpkin soup was a warming winter staple. Maybe I'm cynical but I don't believe that all that bought pumpkin flesh gets eaten after carving, and to my mind that's a massive waste.

On a more positive note, to deal with the year's glut of apples, one of the major supermarkets had a collection point for apples grown by people like you and me outside several shops. They were offered to people for free, despite the usual array of Gala and Braeburn for sale inside. It was the equivalent of the boxes of apples that even in November can still be seen outside private houses, and that's a truly wonderful initiative!

# Take Part for Spring 2026 is now open at Norwich Theatre

Norwich Theatre is inviting everyone to explore their creative side with a diverse and exciting Spring 2026 Take Part season, featuring workshops in dance, music, design, and theatre-making for all ages and abilities.

The new season is blooming with opportunities, from open-access dance classes and musical workshops for babies and toddlers, to specialised programmes in collaboration with the Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC).

Ready to dance your way into spring? Norwich Theatre has a collection of open-access dance classes to help you explore creative, low-impact movement. **Dance Lab** (14 Jan – 11 Feb) is a 5-week programme, perfect for people who are looking to gain new dance and movement skills, in a supportive, accessible format. Designed to enhance wellbeing through exploration and improvisation, this workshop is perfect for taking away new skills and ideas, developing your own dance practices, with no previous experience required.

If you are keen on the traditional techniques, then come along to the **Ballet** sessions (9 Jan – 20 Mar). For anyone over 50, these sessions are designed to support you at any stage of your journey. Open to all, regardless of experience and ability; all you need is enthusiasm and curiosity for the joyful world of dance.

And the little ones don't need to miss out on the excitement either! **Sing, Dance, Play** for both babies and toddlers (16 Jan – 27 Mar) are specially designed, and professionally run musical sessions for parents and their children. Built for you to have fun and move together, this class uses a range of musical instruments and multi-sensory props.

**Theatre Cares – A Life in Music** (8 Jan – 9 Apr) brings together individuals with mild to moderate dementia and their carers/partners for engaging

and participatory music workshops that spark joy, curiosity and new friendships. You will explore music in all its forms, from singing and songwriting to getting handson with drums, chimes, and

stringed and small percussion instruments.

If you are more into the practical side of theatre, from what it takes to put a piece of work together, or the performance side, the new term has an engaging a collection of creative workshops to lean into the behind-the-scenes of theatre making. If you are interested in how a piece of work goes from concept to reality? Page to Stage (22 Jan – 12 Mar) takes a draft script and explores the transition from script to performance. Also part, we are working with costume designer Amanda Harold to create **Ophelia's Dress** (17, 21, 23 Jan), inspired by personal interpretations, and we are inviting you to come along and stitch, sew or embroider your design with us. Bring along a piece of A5 fabric and use any textile techniques you enjoy – embroidery or cross-stitch, crochet or knitting, applique or a combination! We recommend you use plain, pale fabric, and would encourage you to use upcycled or repurposed materials to help reduce environmental impact. # Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

Psychedelic Circus- Now every 3 months their recent evening's musical content came in the form of Scratch Anna and Citizen Smith. Both bands feature an array of musicians with roots going back to 90s Norwich with their current projects being worthy of your attention. Scratch Anna led and fronted by former Steerpike singer Anna musically embraced dance based genres, most notably Trip Hop and Reggae, melded with her thought provoking and occasionally political lyrics making them a band for both the head and feet. Thoroughly recommended. Citizen Smith, for those with long memories include 2 former members of Colourform. They have gone down the route of late 60s garage and jangly guitar influences notably on 'Dogma'. More recent comparisons would perhaps be to early R E M and 90s Teenage Fan Club. If you are a fan of guitar driven alternative pop go see them. This years Psychedelic circus Xmas party will be at The Brickmakers on the 17th December and while I have no confirmations as yet expect circus acts, magicians, poets, stand up comedians, bands and solo artists aplenty, and all for free. In early November storytelling songwriter and former Oysterband man Ray Cooper stopped off in Beccles as part of his UK tour. Alternating between instruments the themes of his songs range from the personal 'Little Flame', written for his daughter and played on the mandolin to the piano centred 'Going Underground' about retreating from the world, something that he regularly does living as he does now in northern Sweden. Historical themes pervade many of his songs with 'The Unknown Soldier' on quitar being based on a true story of a soldier who despite apparently being reliable in battle often drank heavily and absconded for which he was eventually executed. He concluded the night with traditional songs in as he describes his rockabilly rendition of 'Sir Patrick Spens' and a delightful totally acoustic encore and sing-along of 'Wayfaring Stranger'. The evening had begun with his song about the perils of life on the road in the form of the title song from his 'Even for a Shadow' album. What the audience didn't know was that Ray and Tom his tour manager had unfortunately been caught up in a huge tailback of traffic heading east due to 2 horrendous accidents en route which must have

left guite an impression upon them. To be able to get up and put on a performance as good as this took some courage. Superb. Meanwhile I only went to the opening night of this years HRH Prog in Yarmouth in which the stars of the night were most definitely Hawklords. Led by the guitarist and newly crowned legend of prog Jerry Richards their set mostly featured new material including the space rock drenched 'Transmission' with its pulsating bass and drums, oscillating synths, frenetic guitar lines and powerful vocals, and the raucous Rock N Roll of 'Deadzone'. The Hawkwind links and comparisons abound of course and it was perhaps only fitting that they should conclude their set with a superb rendition of Nik Turner's epic track 'Brainstorm' that left a packed out prog audience wanting more. Opening act on the night Seventh Station's mix of rap and metal and final band Head Space's metal meet prog sets sadly did little for me. Ebb meanwhile were for me one of last years great discoveries. However they chose to play the bulk of their new album on the night which while it may grow on me left little impression on the night. They seem to have gone in a far more epic, serious and more dramatic direction both musically and lyrically, and while I may prove to be wrong in the long run, it felt like something was missing, and lacking in comparison to what I heard in 2024.

My own personal 2025- Mostly reclusive, and as I gave up drinking at the start of the year not going out very much. Too expensive to sadly as well. A busy year promoting artists and bands albums and tours. Creatively almost finished writing my first novel (18 of 20 chapters written) + 10 of 18 songs for an album to accompany it begun / completed. More news about that in the next issue. My Favourite gigs and albums by artists and bands that I didn't work with- Merry Hell at Folk on the Pier and their album Rising of the Bold, and Melin Melyn at Norwich Arts centre and their album Mill on the Hill were my 2 favourite gigs and albums with Penguin Café at Folk East my 3rd favourite live set, and Jordsio and Breidablik's joint album 'Kontraster' my 3rd favourite album. From the past-I can't stop listening to The Moody Blues albums from 1967-70.

## **NEW EXHIBITION**


Seeds of Hate and Hope (28 November 2025 - 17 May 2026) presents personal artistic responses to global mass atrocities, such as genocides, ethnic cleansing, war crimes and crimes against humanity. The exhibition explores how artists have witnessed, experienced and responded to atrocity crimes and conflicts with powerful and compelling artworks.


