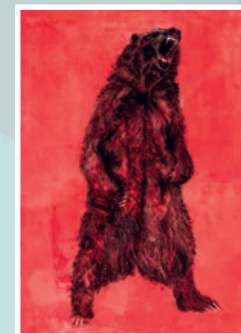

Winter Health Check for Your Cat



Cats are very good at hiding illness. Winter can make changes harder to spot, so regular at home checks are one of the best ways you can protect your cat's health. Know what's normal for your cat. Small changes matter, especially if they last more than a day or two. Use cuddle time to gently look and feel.

Mouth & Teeth

- Breath should not be very smelly
- Gums should be pink, not red or bleeding, or pale
- Watch for dropping food, chewing on one side, or reduced appetite

⚠ Dental pain is common and often hidden. You may not see any of the above signs. Your cat may simply change its behaviour – become quieter or less playful or become grumpy.

Body & Weight

- You should be able to feel ribs easily but not see them
- Watch for weight gain (indoor cats) or weight loss (especially seniors)

Coat & Skin

- Coat should be smooth and shiny

- Look for matting, dandruff, hair loss, or reduced grooming

Winter tip: arthritis can make grooming uncomfortable.

Litter Tray Habits (Very Important)

- You should be concerned if you notice any of the following:

- Straining
- Frequent small wees
- Blood in urine
- Toileting outside the tray

⚠ Straining to urinate is an emergency – seek help immediately.

Mobility & Comfort

- Watch for stiffness, reduced jumping, or hesitation on stairs
- Cats in pain may sleep more, play less, or become grumpy

Cold weather can worsen arthritis. Contact your vet if you notice any changes. Early treatment often means better outcomes.

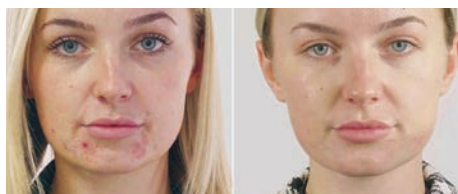

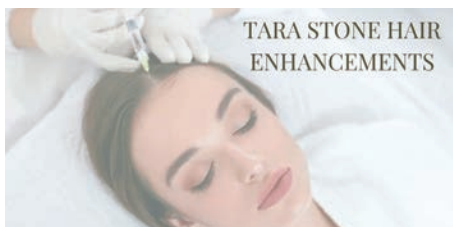

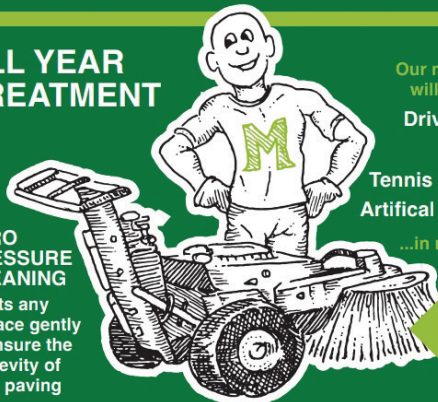

Veg talk

Shakespeare had a character in a play say of Cleopatra that "age cannot wither her, nor custom stale her infinite variety." (Anthony and Cleopatra, Act II, scene II). I feel exactly the same about veg (and hubby, of course!). Let me illustrate.

Picture broccoli, a wonderful, ubiquitous, green vegetable. It's slightly capricious, as the flower head cooks so much faster than the stem. However, the latter can be peeled and grated raw into salads, adding a lovely crisp texture, similar to kohlrabi and radishes. The florets are delicious just steamed, with a little adornment of butter melted over the top.

Even better, in my view, is purple sprouting broccoli which comes into its own when there isn't that much else around that's fresh and local to our climate. It has much more flavour and the whole stalk stays a little crunchy once it's been cooked.

I'm also keeping a close eye on some perennial broccoli, which looks like a forerunner of cauliflower in miniature. The florets are made up of clusters of tiny stars, with a delicate flavour that matches their appearance. It's not easy to get the plants through year one but for some reason I was very lucky last year. My plant is now taking up about a square metre of space and looks like it will burst into many florets any minute. And, of course, with all these broccolis, it is possible to eat the leaves, which taste like a heartier version of spinach.

So here we are: 250 words just about broccoli. Maybe next time I will give sprouts the same treatment.

How to future-proof your bathroom

Be practical

Think about how your life might change over the next 5, 10 or 20 years? Might you require additional support, be looking after elderly relatives or have small children around? If so, a non-slip floor is a good idea and doesn't need to look obviously anti-slip; we have lots of beautiful tiles that have a good grip and won't draw attention. It may also be wise to choose a bath that has a lower edge so that children or less mobile can get in and out easily. Another safety feature to explore is our range of thermostatic shower controls, which have a maximum temperature pre-set when installed to avoid the risk of scalding.

Banish the bath

Generally, many clients feel that as they get older, they no longer have a need for a bath as it can be difficult getting in and out with the added danger of a slip hazard when standing on one foot. Wetrooms are a great alternative for those with reduced mobility or balance as everything is on one level and you can keep the water spray to a minimum with a single fixed glass panel. This will reduce the risk of slipping and tripping and by removing the bath, you allow for a larger, luxury size shower area. Within a shower a fold-away or built-in tiled seat can be a very useful addition and needn't look too obvious or clinical.

Accessories

I think you'll be pleasantly surprised by our selection of grab rails – they look very sleek and can perfectly colour match the other items you have in your bathroom. We consider these items a key part of the design, not a clunky add on, so they are always well incorporated to seamlessly tie in with the rest of the scheme.



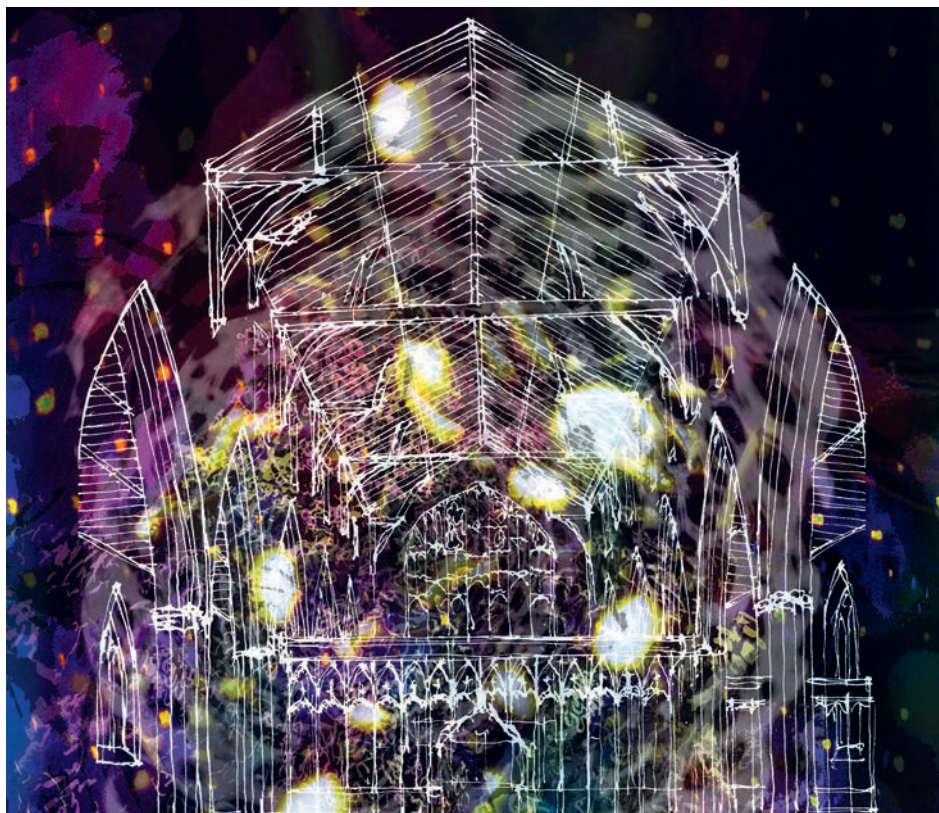
LODDON LIFELONG LEARNERS (formerly Loddon WEA)

Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

The Pre Christmas Psychedelic Circus at The Brickmakers was headlined by the Bedford based Jimi Hendrix tribute band Bold As Love, and was largely attended by a who's who of the alternative scene in Norwich. As well as many of the expected numbers in the form of faithful renditions of 'Foxy Lady' and 'Voodoo Child' it was good to hear a mix of subtle and more obscure tracks, most notably 'Castles In The Sand' and 'Angel'. Supporting them on the night the Behind the Sun Collective mix of wall of sound guitars, swirling synths and tight muscular rhythm section went down well. They were also launching their Fruits De Mer label 7" single release featuring their covers of the T Rex song 'Children of the Revolution' and Funkadelic's 'Maggot Brain'. I have a soft spot for 'C O T R' as it was the first single that I ever bought, or should I say, my mum reluctantly bought for me. Their rendition includes spaced out synths that pan across your speakers, raw edged guitars, a solid rhythm section, harmonious vocals from Dandelion Florence and a somewhat bizarre slightly submerged spoken word outro interspersed with maniacal laughter. A really good take on the original as is 'Maggot Brain' with its cascade of intricately played guitars, and swirling and whirring synths, over a bluesy rhythm section. Well worth investigating. The next Psychedelic Circus at the Brickmakers will be on Wednesday 18th March and should include our new 3 piece Penguins Go Pop line up making our return and playing a mix of some old and some new songs. More acts TBC. See you there.
