Brilliantly bookish events for everyone

It's officially the National Year of Reading and what better way to celebrate than with the return of Norwich Book Festival?

Take your pick from more than 50 events, which will begin on Saturday 24 October, with festival opener Adele Parks – author of 25 best-selling novels, who will bring her latest dark and twisty thriller, *Eyes of You* to the city.

Fiction fans can also look forward to feminist folktales from Irenosen Okojie and *Emma Glass*, a sapphic retelling of *The Odyssey* with Rosie Hewlett, and a deep dive into thrillers with Sophie Hannah and Harriet Tyce (from series 4 of the BBC's *The Traitors*).

The programme also has a rich offer for those who prefer non-fiction, with history events with Dr Kate Lister and Jonn Elledge, to an exploration of the role of the referee in football, and a hopeful take on AI.



Audiences can take away political insights from Iain Dale, business leadership pointers from Mary Portas, uncover hugely entertaining gig-scene stories that took place in the LCR and hear the moving personal story from Hannah Murray (of *Skins* and *Game of Thrones* fame). Celebrate whimsy and small joys with online poet sensation David Larbi, or why not book yourself onto zine of bookbinding workshops?

Young readers are not left out in this festival, which coincides with the October half-term, as Jacqueline Wilson is set to make a return alongside other children's favourite Greg Jenner, of the hilarious *Horrible Histories* – perfect for children who are learning about the Romans at school.

The festival runs until Friday 30 October, with events across the city.

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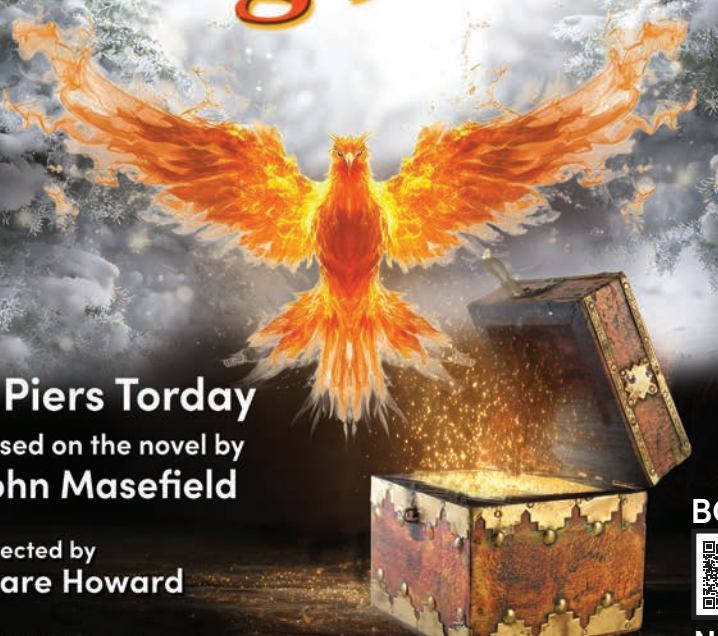


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Hooked on the magic of Christmas!

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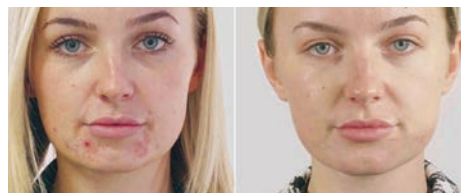


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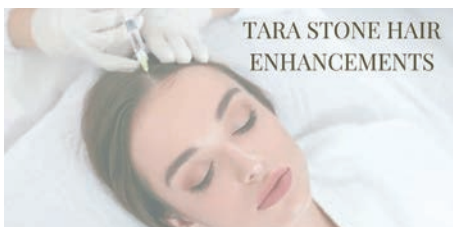

Historic Workhouse Celebrates 250 Years

Staff at Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse are preparing to mark 250 years since the building first opened in July 2027.

Gressenhall 250: More than a Workhouse is made possible with The National Lottery Heritage Fund. Thanks to National Lottery players and the Friends of Gressenhall, the museum will conduct new research, host temporary exhibitions, work with young people and create exciting, costumed events during the anniversary year.

About the site

The iconic workhouse first opened its doors in 1777 as a 'House of Industry' - an institution which provided food, shelter and work for families and individual paupers from the surrounding areas. In 1836 it became a Union Workhouse where families were split up and rules were strict. Many people would have only entered as a last resort. Following the creation of the NHS in 1948, it was run by Norfolk County Council as Beech House Care Home for elderly residents and also provided emergency accommodation for 'evicted families', right up until its transformation into a museum in the 1970s.

The site saw huge changes to health and welfare in the UK. It was home to hundreds of staff and residents, including some of the most vulnerable people in Norfolk. Throughout the anniversary, the museum plans to delve deeper into the full 250-year history, beyond the more well-known years as a Victorian Workhouse.

Get Involved!

Museum staff and volunteers are capturing new oral histories from people who may have lived, worked or visited the site when it was Beech House care home in the 1940's-1970s. Staff are urging anyone who might have memories, photographs or items from the site's history to come forward. Keep an eye on the museum's website for events, exhibitions and activities. 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Richard Penguin's Musical Triangle

Celebrating 20 years of this music column.



Bungay has proved to be a favourite destination this Summer most notably for their fantastic Black Shuck and Folk Festivals. Black Shuck, centred around the legendary mythical dog, had a music stage near to the castle with highlights including finger picked folk songs from Ewan D Rogers, the twin guitar rootsy and bluesy songs of Fools Moon and the Atmospheric, folk based, occasionally ambient soundscapes of the Tom Moore band. This years Folk Festival saw the whole town getting involved and staging concerts, workshops and dances, with most of the events being free entry as well. On the Friday The John Ward trio played a mix of political, personal and humorous songs, Andy Warwick historical Scottish songs, The Shackleton Trio's deft musicianship and lyrically fascinating songs held your attention throughout, while Charlie Law's homespun songs about growing veg and his family were endearing. While the Nordic trio transported us musically to Scandinavia Ramneet Chawla entranced us with her Punjabi Sufi Folk music played on the harmonium and Tambura. Adam Clark mixed songs from his splendid new Norfolk based 'Folk and Fold' album with bluegrass songs, and Rattlebox concluded the day with a rousing mix of songs about drinking and by obscure bands. Saturday brought a fantastic folk union between Cohen Braithwaite Kilcoyne and the East Suffolk Community Folk Orchestra to premier a new piece that he had written performed in a church. It was stunning. Meanwhile Cousin Jack a trio of former Mooncoin and Rum Kelter members played a set of beautifully played tunes in St Mary's church which is where the folk and prog inspired Tin Giants played a very fine set with hints of Yes, meets Steeleye Span and Clanaad. Meanwhile Sleepy Dave Chaplin played authentic acoustic blues at the British Legion, and Clairabella played personal original songs and a diverse mix of covers on the piano in the Holy Trinity church who also had a fine selection of home made cakes. I was pleased to finally get to see Reg Meuross live and he didn't disappoint with his in between song patter being amusing and engaging and his songs from the personal and political to historical winning me over. Concluding my day The Blow Ins delighted a sizeable crowd in the Banqueting suite of the 3 Tuns with a mix of gentle harmonious instrumentals on harp and guitar and some delightfully daft songs. Sunday's highlights included a harmonious acapela set from Sonrisa, Festival patron Sam

Kelly playing a solo acoustic set at the folk picnic mixing traditional and personal songs, a wonderfully eclectic set from Cohen Braithwaite Kilcoyne mixing music hall, Irish and Caribbean songs dextrously played and powerfully sung, and a finale of traditional, nature, and family themed songs from Christina Alden and Alex Patterson with their voices and instruments ringing out and reverberating in the grand surroundings of St Mary's church. A fine conclusion to an amazing weekend organised by local musicians Pete Sewell and Vicky Lambert that has become a favourite Summer festival. A longer review will follow on the Fatea website. At Afri Fest in Chapelfield gardens I really enjoyed sets by K O G from Ghana mixing traditional instruments in the form of Kalimba's and Balafon's with guitars and synths to create a fusion of musical genres, and the often complex rhythms of Kasima Mutua notably the Latin inspired concluder with hints of Santana. Finally I got to see an amazing set from banjo man Dan Walsh at a Cornucutter promotions night mixing personable songs with unbelievably fast and nimble fingered playing that had to be seen to be believed. How sparks weren't flying out of that Banjo I will never know. PENGUINS GO POP – Now a 3 piece we recently played 3 festivals in North Norfolk + The Boosh bar in Bury St Edmunds. We are playing at the Peasants Tavern in North Walsham on Saturday 10th October and play a Norwich gig for the first time in more than two and a half years at The Reindeer on Sunday 25th October at 4.30 pm. We will be playing a mix of old and new songs and will be returning to recording our album from November until early 2027. It will be great to see you.
